What people think in Primrose Hill

When we spoke to people in Primrose Hill at the end of last year, we had 260 responses from people in the community about what they thought was important in your area.

We'll use this information, as well as your thoughts and ideas, to plan how we can support and implement your ideas in the coming year.

The main issues people talked about were:



Activities for children

49 responses said there weren't enough activities for children in the area.

Community issues

49 responses said that issues such as parking, police numbers and feeling safe at night were important.



The environment

72 responses were about the local environment being important. This includes issues like litter, dog fouling, tidy gardens and parks, pests and potholes.

Crime and anti-social behaviour

90 responses were about anti-social behaviour. This included crime, drugs and alcohol, nuisance driving and motorbikes, noise and gangs.

To make real change in your community, people need to work together. So as well as our Big Clean Up, we're launching a locality plan and community forum to help you have a voice and make your area an even better place to live.
