A 'budding' service for The Clarences

Thirteen has teamed up with Billingham Environmental Link Project (BELP) to introduce a new tool-loan service for residents of The Clarences.

The scheme, which was introduced in November, offers a range of equipment for residents to borrow to help them with their garden maintenance.

The equipment available includes:

- lawn mowers • strimmers • hedge cutters • forks
- spades • trowels • hoes

Anyone who wants to borrow any gardening equipment can go along to the BELP allotments on Wednesdays between 1pm and 3pm.

We'd advise you to go along on the day to find out about the equipment that's available – first come, first served!

The service was introduced following feedback from the local community about the Neighbourhood Plan. People told us that it was difficult to maintain their gardens as they couldn't access affordable equipment.

We hope this service proves to be useful and well-used by the community, particularly as in early Spring, we hope to run a garden competition. We'll be looking for the best gardens in Port Clarence and will have categories including Most Improved Garden, Smartest Over 60s Garden, and Best Overall Garden Award.

Neighbourhood walkabouts

Linda Deakin and Jo Hill are the neighbourhood officers for your area. They are regularly out and about in your neighbourhood and carrying out walkabouts on estates which you're welcome to join in with.

The walkabouts, also known as estate inspections, involve walking around the estates where Thirteen's homes are located, and identifying issues that might need to be tackled.
